CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: This course examines the developmental characteristics of children ages 6 through 12 years and the components of high quality out of school care programs. Students will acquire the knowledge and skills to ensure that the environment, experiences and interactions meet the needs of school age children.

CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS: 3(45)

DELIVERY MODE(S): Classes will be comprised of lecture, independent and small group tasks and class discussions.

OBJECTIVES (OPTIONAL): Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- ➤ Describe the physical, social, and emotional developmental characteristics of school age children and their motor, cognitive, communication, and creative skill development.
- ➤ Describe strategies child care professionals can use to support and enhance all aspects of the development of school-age children.
- ➤ Identify the components of an effective, high quality out of school care program.
- ➤ Develop and implement a program plan that considers the experiences, materials, and environment that best support the goals and philosophy of best practice in school-age school care.

TRANSFERABILITY: Grade of D or D+ may not be acceptable for transfer to other post-secondary institutions. Students are cautioned that it is their responsibility to contact the receiving institutions to ensure transferability.
